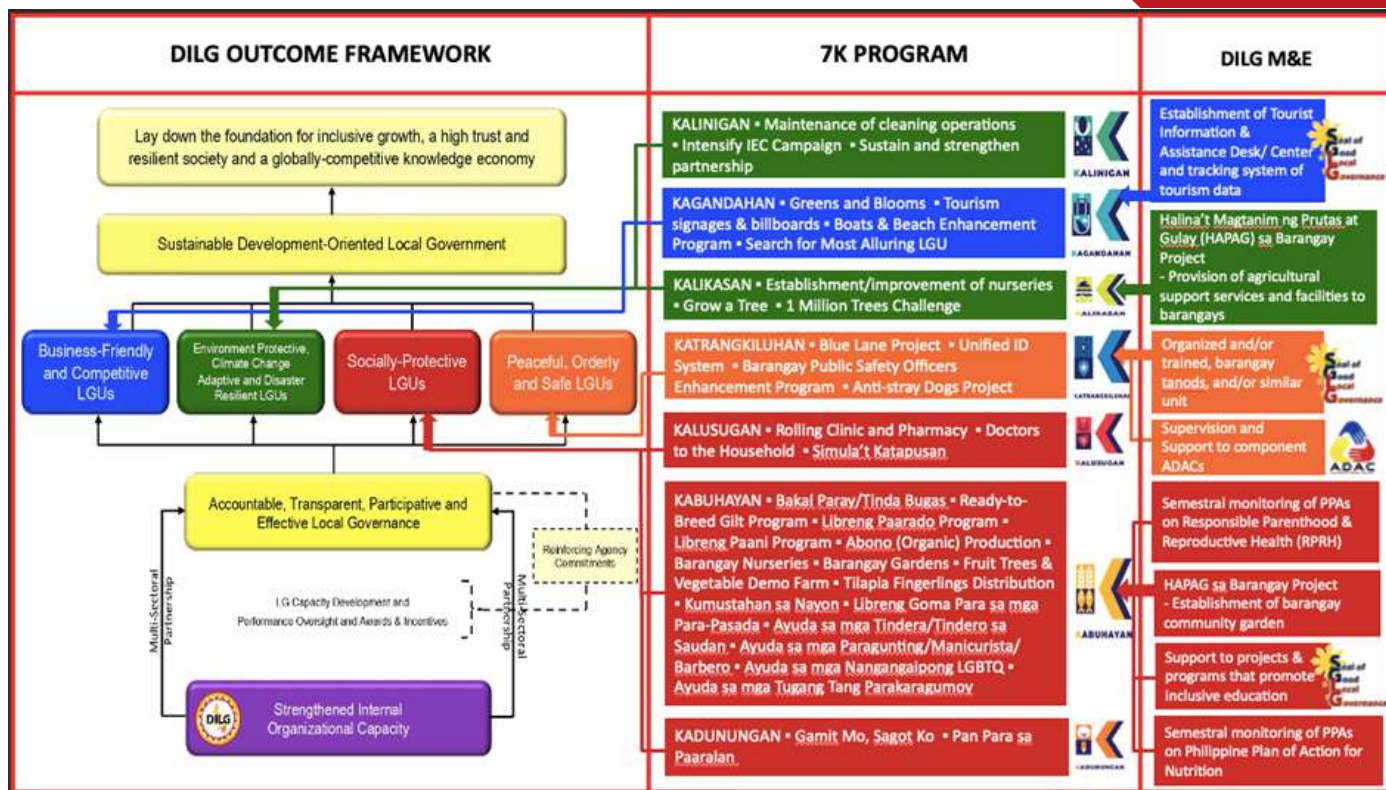

# TOWARDS STRENGTHENING THE DILG AND LGU PARTNERSHIP



**Framework 1. DILG-7K Harmonized Framework**

The DILG – Local Government Sector is mandated to develop and scale up the capacities of LGUs, render performance oversight, and provide incentives to LGUs that excel and perform. The DILG Outcome Framework highlights the significance of our mandate in the general structure of local government units and of the society as a whole, and in the attainment of national goals and objectives. The framework shows that our PPAs implemented through multi-sectoral partnerships, are more than outputs for compliance but they actually contribute to the attainment of sectoral and societal outcomes with the LGUs and the citizenry as the ultimate beneficiaries.

The 7K Program, Gov. Jose Edwin B. Hamor's flagship program, addresses the multi-sectoral issues in the Province of Sorsogon thru the implementation of its seven (7) components, viz: Kalinigan, Kagandahan, Kalikasan, Katrangkiluhan, Kalusugan, Kabuhayan and Kadunungan. The collaboration between PLGU and its component LGUs aims towards the holistic development of the Province while building an empowered and resilient community.

Framework 1. DILG-7K Harmonized Framework shows the alignment of the 7K Program to the sub-sectoral outcomes of the DILG Outcome Framework along with some DILG Monitoring and Evaluation tools where some of the component projects of the 7K Program will come in. The DILG M&E tools provided herein are not absolute and are only examples on some of the Department's mechanism in the exercise of our performance oversight and incentives functions to LGUs. Also, the 7K Program is continuously improved thus, the Framework may not reflect all the updated program components.

The DILG-7K Harmonized Framework generally aims to establish the context that the PPAs of the LGUs and the DILG are all gearing towards the attainment of sectoral and societal outcomes, and national goals and objectives. Understanding the Framework will enable us to come up with better strategies to ensure coordinated efforts in sustaining the excellent performance and overcoming challenges in the implementation of PPAs. DILG Sorsogon is continuously looking for ways on how we can better collaborate with our stakeholders in the implementation of our programs and provide valuable inputs on policy direction and technical guidance to LGUs.

# 2022 SEAL OF GOOD LOCAL GOVERNANCE (SGLG): Pagkilala sa Katapatan at Kahusayan ng Pamahalaang Lokal

The **SEAL OF GOOD LOCAL GOVERNANCE (SGLG)** is the highest recognition and most prestigious award given by the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) to excellent and performing local government units in the delivery of public services through compliance to national laws and guidelines. It is a progressive assessment system that gives distinction to remarkable local government performance across several areas, and puts primacy to integrity and good performance as pillars of meaningful local autonomy and development.

In 2019, the SGLG was finally institutionalized as an award, incentive, honor and recognition-based program with the enactment of Republic Act No. 11292 or the SGLG Act and commenced with its first full-blown implementation in the year 2022.

As a progressive assessment system, its criteria are regularly updated or upgraded to meet the challenges of the changing times. From the seven (7) governance areas, the SGLG now looks into ten (10) governance areas and maintain the “all-in” principle, where LGUs must pass all the following assessment areas:



The SGLG Assessment’s comprehensive coverage engages all Provinces, Cities and Municipalities across the country. For a province to qualify, ten percent (10%) of its component cities and municipalities must also be passers.

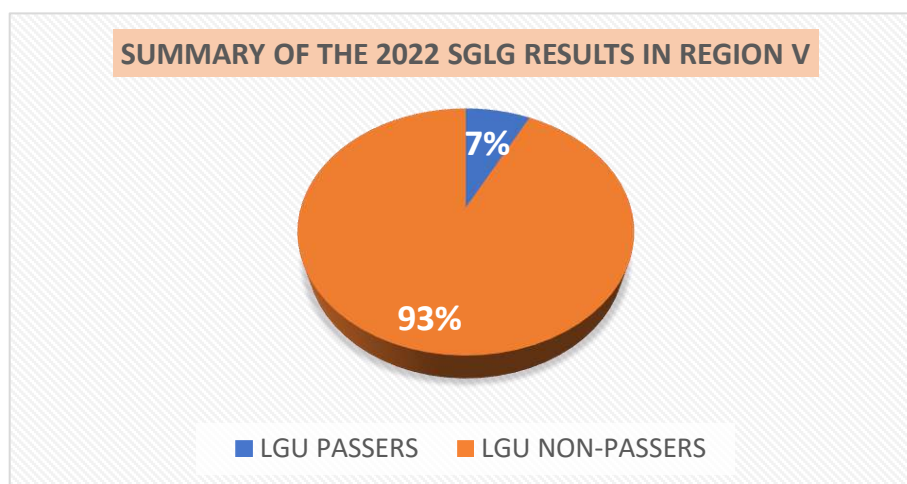
The graphs below illustrate the results of the 2022 SGLG National Assessment in Region V. It is clear that out of 120 provinces, cities, and



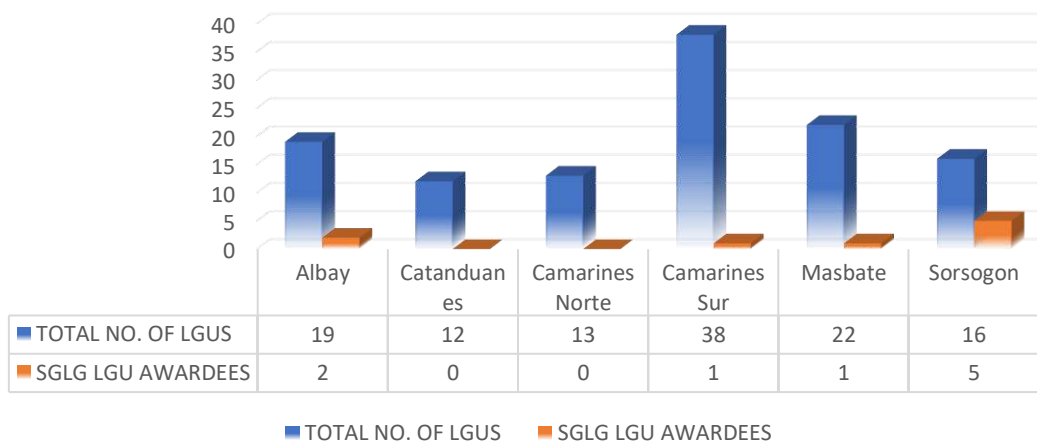
municipalities regionwide, only nine (9) LGUs were conferred with the most coveted 2022 Seal of Good Local Governance (SGLG) National Awards during the First Cluster Awarding Ceremony at The Manila Hotel on December 14, 2022. This number makes up the 7% SGLG Regional average for Region 5.

The breakdown of LGUs shows that out of the 4 provinces in the region with SGLG awardees, the province of Sorsogon garnered the highest number, with a total of 5 awards comprised of 4 municipalities and 1 city receiving the Seal, or 31% of its total LGUs. Inferring a strong performance for the province, this shows that Sorsogon's provincial average is 23.75% greater than the aforementioned regional average. The fact that Sorsogon is the only province out of the four (4) to have both Municipal and City awardees is particularly noteworthy; the other three (3) provinces only have City Awardees.

# 2021 GOOD FINANCIAL HOUSEKEEPING

The **Good Financial Housekeeping (GFH)** formerly known as the Seal of Good Housekeeping, is an annual assessment of the different provinces, cities, and municipalities nationwide based on their performance and initiatives in sustaining good practices of fiscal accountability and transparency in local governance.

The GFH certification from the DILG is a complete proof that the LGUs had spent and audited its public funds completely and with full transparency.

It has been pragmatic in increasing transparency and accountability and is one of the 10 assessment areas for an LGU before it can be awarded with the Seal of Good Local Governance (SGLG).

## **Criteria to pass the GFH are:**

- a) Most recent available COA Audit Opinion is Unqualified or Qualified for CYs 2019 or 2020; and
- b) Compliance with the Full Disclosure Policy – posting of financial documents in 3 conspicuous places and in the FDP Portal for CY 2020 all quarters and CY 2021 1<sup>st</sup> quarter posting period documents.

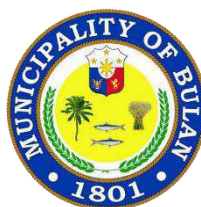

# CY 2022 GAWAD KALASAG SEAL AND SPECIAL AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE IN DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE

Gawad KALASAG (KAlamidad at sakuna LABanan, SARiling Galing ang kaligtasan) was established in 1998, in Search for Excellence in Disaster Risk Reduction and Management and Humanitarian Assistance. It has served as the country’s recognition and award scheme for various stakeholders who promote and implement disaster risk reduction and management, climate change adaptation (DRRM-CCA), and humanitarian assistance programs that protect and shield high risk communities against extreme hazards and render them more capable of addressing their vulnerabilities.

Commencing CY 2022, the GK will cover the (1) GK Seal for Local DRRM Councils and Offices (LDRRMCO); (2) GK Special Awards for CSOs; (3) Best Private Organizations; (4) Best Government Emergency Management and Response Teams (GEMs); and (5) GK Special Recognition for Individuals and Organizations.

The assessment for schools and hospitals, meanwhile, will be postponed until 2023 to give way to the transition of the GK Seal for Schools and Hospitals, as well as to allow the concerned lead agencies to spearhead the enhancement of their selection process and assessment tools. In addition, this will also allow the concerned lead agencies to program the necessary budget.

## 2021 SEAL OF CHILD-FRIENDLY LOCAL GOVERNANCE AUDIT

The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) and the Council for the Welfare of Children (CWC) developed and launched the Child-Friendly Local Governance Audit (CFLGA) in 2014 following the recommendations of the 2012 study entitled "Towards More Effective Local Councils for the Protection of Children (LCPCs) in child Rights Responsive Governance in the Philippines".

Under the CFLGA, the LGUs are assessed based on set indicators. The audit process involves data gathering at the city/municipal level, data validation and review at the provincial and regional level and table validation and conferment at the national level. This is being done through the Inter-Agency Monitoring Task Force (IMTF).

LGUs that pass the CFLGA are conferred with the Seal of Child-Friendly Local Governance (SCFLG) by the CWC Board. Moreover, the SCFLG is a requirement for both the Seal of Good Local Governance (SGLG) and the Presidential Award for child-Friendly Municipalities and Cities (PACFMC).

During the 2021 Child Friendly Local Governance Audit (CFLGA), the province of Sorsogon was able to produce 7 passers out of the 15 LGUs that undergone the assessment.

# ANTI-DRUG ABUSE COUNCIL PERFORMANCE AUDIT RESULTS

In compliance to the DILG Memorandum Circular 2022-034 on the conduct of 2021 Anti-drug Abuse Council (ADAC) performance audit, the Department of the Interior Local Government- Sorsogon conducted the 2021 ADAC Performance Audit on May 12-13, 2022 at Una Pizzeria, Bitan-o, Sorsogon City.

The activity was a collaborative effort of DILG Sorsogon, Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA), Philippine National Police, together with Civil Society Organization representatives.

The 2021 ADAC Performance Audit aims to assess the functionality and effectiveness of local ADACs based on existing issuances and policies, determine ADAC-initiated and/or endorsed innovations and best practices at all levels, create a platform for evaluation and assessment, and recognize the best, effective, and performing ADACs.

The 15 local ADACs was evaluated by the Provincial Audit Team (PAT) according to six indicators, to wit:

1. Creation or reorganization of ADAC;
2. Allocation of a Substantial amount as indicated in the ADAC Plan;
3. Formulation and Implementation of Plans and Programs;
4. Supervision and Support to component ADACs;
5. Conduct of meetings, and
6. Innovation/s.

# PEACE AND ORDER COUNCIL PERFORMANCE AUDIT RESULTS

The Peace and Order Council (POC) is the government's platform for stronger collaboration of the LGU with law enforcement agencies and the community to fight criminality, illegal drugs, insurgency, and violent extremism. It creates an enabling environment among its members to harmonize and effectively implement peace and order and public safety activities.

Section 9 of DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2019-143 or the Omnibus Guidelines for Peace and Order Councils (POCs) reiterates that the POC Performance Audit shall be conducted annually to identify the compliance rating of sub-national POCs and POC Secretariats.

A POC performance audit for CY 2020 was not conducted due to the suspension/cancellation of Projects, Programs, and Activities of POCs and the reallocation of their funds for COVID-19 response.

The POC Performance Audit aims to:

1. Assess the performance of the Regional, Provincial, City and Municipal POCs on their functionality;
2. Identify the innovations conducted and initiated by the POCs and their POC Secretariats;
3. Determine possible interventions and improvement strategies for POCs and POC Secretariats; and
4. Create a platform for evaluation, assessment, and sharing of best practices between and among POCs and POC secretariats.

A sub-national POC is considered functional, and may only be eligible for awards, if it garners an overall percentage score of 65% or higher, provided, that in any Pillar scores, it does not have a score lower than 50% of the required score.

## **2021 SEAL OF GOOD LOCAL GOVERNANCE FOR BARANGAY**

The Seal of Good Local Governance for Barangay (SGLGB) is an award, incentive, honor and recognition-based program for all barangays which encourages their commitment to continuously progress, improve their performances along various governance areas, and become champions of good barangay governance in their areas of jurisdiction.

Taking into account the important role of the barangay in the overall development and transformation of the community and the nation, the Department first implemented the Pilot Testing of the Seal of Good Local Governance for Barangay (SGLGB) on 2021 to encourage and challenge barangays to scale up its performance and practices of good governance that accord primacy to the principles of accountability, transparency, performance and effectiveness.

Like SGLG, the SGLGB is a progressive award system. It will assess the barangays in the following performance areas: (1) Safety, Peace and Order; (2) Financial Administration and Sustainability; (3) Disaster Preparedness; (4) Social Protection and Sensitivity; (5) Business-Friendliness and Competitiveness; and (6) Environmental Management.

## CIVIL SOCIETY ORGANIZATION ACCREDITATION

Participation of CSOs is a vital part of good governance which the DILG aims to integrate into Local Government Units (LGUs) processes, planning, program/project implementation, and monitoring. In relation to this, DILG issued guidelines to the LGUs on its accreditation processes. CSO accreditation is a regular year-round activity of LGUs however for the purpose of membership to Local Special Bodies (LSBs), accreditation of CSOs is scheduled from August- 2<sup>nd</sup> week of September 2022 as stated in the DILG Memorandum Circular 2020-083 (Guidelines for the Accreditation of Civil Society Organization and Selection of Representatives to Local Special Bodies) issued last June 15, 2022. The DILG ensures that the CSO's membership to LSBs is legitimate by undergoing the accreditation process stated in the said memorandum circular.

## COMPREHENSIVE LAND USE PLAN

The CLUP is the plan for the management of local territories. Planning as management of local territories is a function of the LGU pursuant to its status as a political unit. Hence, the body principally responsible for the CLUP is no less than the highest policy-making body, the legislative council or Sanggunian. This is the reason why the adoption of the CLUP and its enactment into a zoning ordinance are planning functions exercised exclusively by the Sanggunian (RA 7160, Section 20c, 447, 458, 468).

In a word, the CLUP is the long-term guide for the physical development of the local area, the framework for the management and co-management of the local territory. At the city and municipal levels, the CLUP serves more than a framework plan. It is at this level where the CLUP is enacted into a zoning ordinance (RA 7160, Sec. 20c) hence, it becomes a statutory plan whose provisions are not merely indicative but are legally enforceable.

# LOCAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT PLAN (LDRRMP)

Sec. 12 of R.A. No. 10121 states that among the duties of LDRRMOs is to formulate and implement a comprehensive LDRRMP. LDRRM Plan sets out goals and specific objectives for reducing disaster risks together with related actions to accomplish these objectives. It covers four (4) DRRM Thematic Areas: prevention and mitigation, preparedness, response, and rehabilitation and recovery.

It also provides for the identification of hazards, vulnerabilities, and risks to be managed at the local level; disaster risk reduction and management approaches and strategies to be applied in managing said hazards and risks; monitoring & evaluation system, among others.

# LOCAL CLIMATE CHANGE ACTION PLAN

Sec. 11 (b) of R.A. No. 10121 states that among the duties of LDRRMCs is to “Ensure the integration of disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation into local development plans, programs, and budgets as a strategy in sustainable development and poverty reduction.” In addition, the National Disaster Preparedness Plan: Disaster Preparedness Minimum Standards Vol. 2 states that LCCAPs are required for provinces, cities, and municipalities.

The LCCAP sets out the strategies of an LGU to mitigate and adapt to the impacts of climate change. Depending on the planning scenarios in the LGUs, the LCCAP may either be integrated into the PDPFP/CLUP/CDP or it may be a stand-alone document.

In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, NDRRMC MC 57 s. 2020 was issued enjoining, amongst others, all LGUs to update their respective Public Service Continuity Plans and CPs due to ongoing public health emergency.

## 2023 GAD PLAN AND BUDGET

The PCW-DILG-DBM-NEDA Joint Memorandum Circular 2013-01, titled "Guidelines on the Localization of the Magna Carta of Women" was issued on July 18, 2013 to prescribe policies in mainstreaming gender perspective in local planning, programming and budgeting, local legislation, project development, implementation, monitoring and evaluation pursuant to Republic Act 9710 or the Magna Carta of Women (MCW).

Subsequently, JMC 2016-01 was issued on January 12, 2016 to amend parts of Section 4.1.C Gender and Development (GAD) Planning and Budgeting) and 5.0 (Monitoring and Evaluating the implementation of the Magna Carta of Women. The JMC also clarify the process of costing, allocation and attribution of the GAD budget, as well as the duties and functions of the Department of the Interior and local Government as the lead agency in the review, endorsement and monitoring of submission of GAD Plans and Budget (GPBs) and GAD Accomplishment Reports (GAD ARs) of local government units (LGUs).

On July 23, 2020, Memorandum Circular No. 2020-105, or the "The Adoption of the Use of the Gender and Development Plan and Budget Monitoring System (GAD-PBMS)," was issued to serve as a guide in accessing the website. GAD-PBMS was designed for the LGUs to upload their GAD Plan and Budgets as well as the GAD Accomplishment Reports.

Through the website, the DILG could check and review the uploaded GAD PBs as well as the GAD ARs of the LGU without the trouble of submitting hard documents which require much time, efforts and resources.

For year 2022, LGUs were required to submit the LGU's GAD Plan and Budget for 2023 and here is the status of their compliance.

## DEVOLUTION TRANSITION PLAN

To support transition to full devolution, Section 10 of EO No. 138, s. 2021, all LGUs are directed to formulate and prepare their Devolution Transition Plans (DTPs) to guide the transition in their full assumption of the devolved rules and responsibilities.

The DTP shall serve as the LGU's roadmap to ensure strategic perspective, systematic, and coherent actions towards their full assumption of devolved functions and services. The DTP shall also be a primary consideration in the formulation of the successor local development plans and investment programs, particularly in identifying and implementing priority programs and activities relative to the devolved functions and services.

To foster the alignment of priorities and complementation of resources, the LGUs shall use their DTPs to influence the design of the devolution transition activities of the NGAs concerned, and direct NGA support along the capacity requirements of the LGUs.

To leverage support from other governance stakeholders including NGOs, CSOs, POs, business sector, and academic institutions as the LGUs engage them for cooperative undertakings during the devolution transition period, particularly on the areas of capacity building, service delivery, and livelihood development.

Lastly, the DTP shall serve as guide in the monitoring and performance assessment of the LGUs by the DBM, DILG, and NGAs concerned.

## **LOCAL INVESTMENT AND INCENTIVE CODE (LIIC)**

The Local Investments and Incentives Code (LIIC) is a document that articulates the local government investment policies and programs, investment priority areas, local incentives available to domestic and foreign investors and the mechanics for availing them.

DILG-DTI JMC No. 2011-01 entitled "Formulation of Local Investment and Incentives Code (LIIC)" provides for the guidelines in formulating the local investment and incentive code in a proactive measure to draw local and foreign investments especially in priority areas or industries for development and as a tool to define the development thrust of the LGU consistent

Per DILG-DTI JMC No. 2011-01, it aims to engage the Leagues of Provinces, Cities and Municipalities to provide cohesive force in establishing strong collaboration among LGUs and national agencies in the formulation and implementation of local investment ordinances, rules and regulations and policies, and ensuring that local initiatives are consistent with national investment laws, rules and regulations and policies.

To enhance the competitiveness of the local investment climate, all LGUs need to formulate or update their code.

## LOCAL REVENUE CODE (LRC)

The primordial justification for the existence of local government units within the framework defined by the 1991 local government code is the rational management of the development of their respective communities.

The power of local government to levy taxes, fees and charges is provided in the Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines. Under Section 5, Article X, the Constitution provides:

*"Section 5. Each local government unit shall have the power to create its own sources of revenues and to levy taxes, fees and charges subject to such guidelines and limitations as the Congress may provide, consistent with the basic policy of local autonomy. Such taxes, fees and charges shall accrue exclusively to the local governments."*

As a result of the financial crisis due to pandemic, there is a predisposition that the Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) of local government will drop. This scenario will somehow affect the delivery of basic services considering that majority of our local governments are IRA dependent. To minimize adverse effect, there is a need to prepare the local government units in broadening their tax base and explore avenues to enhance their collection efficiencies through formulation or updating of their Local Revenue Code. The Code will provide policies and guidelines in developing the new strategies on how LGUs explore innovative ways in enhancing their financial capacities and generates more revenues that will create a robust economy.

# PEACE AND ORDER & PUBLIC SAFETY PLAN

Each Provincial, City and Municipal POC and Barangay Peace and Order Committee shall formulate a 3-year, term-based, Peace and Order and Public Safety Plan (POPS Plan), which shall be incorporated in the Comprehensive Development of the Local Government Unit.

The Peace and Order and Public Safety Plan consists of programs and activities to promote peace and order and public safety in a particular locality and consolidated Integrated Area/Community Public Safety Plan of the LGU as specified in DILG MC no. 2019-143.

All Peace and Order Councils (POCs) are expected to develop their Peace and Order and Public Safety (POPS) Plan within 200 days after the assumption of office of the newly elected Local Chief Executives. As of this date, these are the municipalities in the Province of Sorsogon with updated POPS Plan:

# ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN

Through the DILG, all Local Chief Executives are enjoined to strictly observe the provisions of Republic Act No. 9003, otherwise known as the "Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2001" and Department issuances relative thereto, to wit: Memorandum Circular No. 2001-19 entitled: "Implementation of Republic Act 9003, otherwise known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000"; Memorandum Circular No. 2001-38 entitled: "Addendum to DILG MC 2001-19 re: Implementation of Republic Act 9003, otherwise known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000"; and Memorandum Circular No. 2009-168 entitled: "Strict Implementation of Sections 17 (H) and 32 of Republic Act No. 9003, known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000".

Pursuant to Section 50 of R.A. No. 9003, failure to enforce and implement the provisions of Republic Act No. 9003 and rules and regulation promulgated with respect thereto shall subject local government officials to administrative sanctions in accordance with R.A. No. 7160 and other existing laws, rules and regulations.

Relative thereto, all Local Chief Executives are enjoined to issue an executive order on the formulation of the Ecological Solid Waste Management Board to monitor the compliance of the LGU.

## FY 2021 LOCAL GOVERNMENT SUPPORT FUND PROJECTS

### **SUPPORT TO BARANGAY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (SBDP)**

The Support to Barangay Development Program (SBDP) aims to provide the priority barangay the much need infrastructure and social services to address existing issues and development gaps in the pursuit of sustainable peace and prosperity

These approved priority projects are in accordance with the Local Budget Circular No. 135 funded under FY 2021 GAA, having a total of **Php 16.44 billion** for the **822 beneficiary barangays** nationwide.

**Php 320 million** from the total allocated budget will go to the **16 barangays** from the Province of Sorsogon with each barangay entitled to Php 20 million worth of project funds.

### **FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS (FALGU)**

The Financial Assistance to Local Government Units (FALGU) aims to prioritized assistance programs and projects on education, health and social protection in light with the COVID-19 pandemic and infrastructure projects consistent to the *Build, Build, Build* Program of the National Government.

These are in accordance with the Local Budget Circular No. 131 stating that the appropriated amount shall be utilized to support programs and projects such as 1) construction, concreting, rehabilitation, repair, or improvement of approved structures, 2) purchase of approved vehicles, 3) barangay electrification, 4) purchase of medical equipment 5) financial assistance for health and sports program, 6) assistance to education, health and social protection in light of COVID-19 pandemic, 7) assistance to indigent individuals.

**Php 32 million** total allocated budget for **4 LGUs** from the Province of Sorsogon namely PLGU, LGU Irosin, LGU Matnog and LGU Barcelona amounting to Php 16 million, Php 10 Million, Php 2 Million and Php 4 Million respectively.



## FY 2021 LOCAL GOVERNMENT SUPPORT FUND PROJECTS

### **DISASTER REHABILITATION AND RECONSTRUCTION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (DRRAP)**

The Disaster Rehabilitation and Reconstruction Assistance Program (DRRAP) aims to provide assistance in the recovery and reconstruction of the economy and livelihood in the LGU's that are directly affected by the

Taal Volcano Eruption, Typhoon Quinta, Typhoon Rolly, and Typhoon Ulysses that left portions of the country devastated. Fund allocation for DRRAP shall be computed depending on the type of calamity and shall be on prorated basis considering several factors as stated in Local Budget Circular 134.

DRRAP particularly aims to support priority projects such as 1) construction of shelters and resettlement, 2) construction of public infrastructure, 3) education and health services, 4) agriculture, and 5) social protection.

16 Local Government Units (LGUs) from the province of Sorsogon are beneficiaries of DRRAP, with total budget allocation of **Php 62,695,988.00**.



## FY 2022 LOCAL GOVERNMENT SUPPORT FUND PROJECTS

### SUPPORT TO BARANGAY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (SBDP)

The Support to Barangay Development Program (SBDP) aims to provide the priority barangay the much need infrastructure and social services to address existing issues and development gaps in the pursuit of sustainable peace and prosperity

These approved priority projects are in accordance with the Local Budget Circular No. 144 funded under FY 2022 GAA, having a total of **Php 5.624billion** for the **1,406 beneficiary barangays** nationwide.

**Php 608 million** from the total allocated budget will go to the **152 barangays** from the Province of Sorsogon with each barangay entitled to Php 4 million worth of project funds.

### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS (FALGU)

The Financial Assistance to Local Government Units (FALGU) aims to prioritized infrastructure projects consistent to the *Build, Build, Build* Program of the National Government.

These are in accordance with the Local Budget Circular No. 142 funded under FY 2022 GAA, having a total of **Php 5,007,000.00** for support to Capital Outlays and social programs to LGUs nationwide except for LGUs under the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao

The appropriated amount shall be utilized to support priority programs and projects such as 1) construction, concreting, rehabilitation, repair, or improvement of approved structures, 2) purchase of approved vehicles, 3) barangay electrification, 4) purchase and installation of CCTV Surveillance System, and 6) assistance to indigent individuals or families following DBM's indicative ceiling.

The Local Budget Circular No. 142 and 142-A was amended to LBC 142-B issued on August 16, 2022 which includes extension of submission of request for financial assistance to LGUs affected by calamity(ies) or disaster(s) that occurred in Calendar Year 2022.

A total of **4 LGUs** from the Province of Sorsogon are beneficiaries of FALGU 2022, with a total budget allocation of **Php 19 million**.



## FY 2022 LOCAL GOVERNMENT SUPPORT FUND PROJECTS

### **GROWTH EQUITY FUND (GEF)**

The FY 2022 Local Government Support Fund – Growth Equity Fund (LGSF-GEF), with an appropriated amount of **Php 1.25 billion**, covers the funding requirements of programs, projects and activities of poor, disadvantaged and lagging LGUs to gradually enable the full and efficient implementation and delivery of functions and services devolved to them in accordance with the Executive Order (EO) No. 138 s. 2021

In the province of Sorsogon, three (3) Municipal LGUs and eleven (11) Barangay LGUs, total of 14 LGUs, were identified as beneficiaries. A total amount of **Php 24,884,560.00**, which was distributed to the beneficiary LGUs to provide financial assistance in the implementation of PPAs included in their respective Devolution Transition Plan (DTP), Local Government Investment Program (LDIP) and Annual Investment Plan (AIP).

### **SEAL OF GOOD LOCAL GOVERNANCE – INCENTIVE FUND (SGLG – IF)**

The Seal of Good Local Governance – Incentive Fund (SGLG – IF) or formerly known as the Performance Challenge Fund (PCF) is an incentive program encouraging all provinces, cities and municipalities to improve on their performance and service delivery.

A total of one (1) City and four (4) Municipalities were beneficiaries of SGLG – IF in the province of Sorsogon with total allocation of **Php 27 million**.





## **OTHER LOCAL GOVERNMENT SUPPORT FUND PROJECTS**

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### **ASSISTANCE TO DISADVANTAGE MUNICIPALITIES (ADM)**

The Assistance to Disadvantage Municipalities (ADM) program provides a "catch-up mechanism" to assist municipal governments in increasing citizens' access to basic facilities and ensures participation of civil society organizations (CSOs) in local governance.

The program aimed to contribute to the full attainment of empowered, responsible and responsive LGUs (Local Government Units). It served as a tool to assist all municipalities to access basic facilities by strengthening the LDCs (Local Development Councils) to become more able partners in national development and strengthening of LGU abilities to deliver basic services.

### **ASSISTANCE TO MUNICIPALITIES (AM)**

Assistance to Municipalities (AM) Program seeks to equitably assist all municipalities in the delivery of basic services by providing financial subsidy to municipalities for the implementation of their priority programs and projects.

The AM funded projects culled out from the Local Development Investment Programs (LDIP) of municipalities and consistent with and limited to "disaster risk reduction-related facilities and equipment, peace

promoting projects, and/or other infrastructure projects that will address delivery of basic services of the municipalities.



## **OTHER LOCALLY FUNDED PROJECTS**

### **BOTTOM-UP BUDGETING (BuB)**

The Bottom-up Budgeting (BUB) process is one of the major reform initiatives of the Aquino administration, making government's budgeting process more responsive to local needs. It has also opened avenue for people's participation in local planning and budgeting through the engagement of Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and basic sectors of the communities as part of the local governance reform; it provides LGUs incentives for good local governance.

Started out in 2012, the BuB projects are mainly designed for poverty alleviation and disaster mitigation. They correspond to the government's priorities of providing basic social services and attainment of the Millennium Development Goals; hunger mitigation and elimination; job generation and inclusive development; and, Climate change adaptation/mitigation and disaster preparedness.

### **SAGANA AT LIGTAS NA TUBIG SA LAHAT (SALINTUBIG)**

The Program aims to contribute to the attainment of the goal of providing potable water to the entire country and the targets defined in the Philippine Development Plan 2011-2016, Millennium Development Goals (MDG), and the Philippine Water Supply Sector Roadmap and the Philippine Sustainable Sanitation Roadmap.

It is designed to provide water supply systems for waterless municipalities and intend to enhance/improve local capacities of the LGUs/Water Supply Service providers in planning, implementation and operation and management of water supply facilities in a sustainable manner.

### **CONDITIONAL MATCHING GRANT TO PROVINCES (CMGP)**

The Conditional Matching Grant to Provinces (CMGP) for Road Repair, Rehabilitation, and Improvement (formerly KALSADA) is a partnership program between the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) and Department of Budget and Management (DBM) for Provincial Local Government Units in response to the needed infrastructure support, as well as reforms in local roads management (LRM) and public financial management (PFM).



The Program is designed to contribute to a robust and competitive national economy. CMGP aims to improve the state of local roads, and connect these to national road networks. This will enhance local and regional productivity easing out value chain bottlenecks in agriculture, tourism and manufacturing.

### **PERFORMANCE CHALLENGE FUND (PCF)**

The Performance Challenge Fund (PCF) is a financial subsidy facility envisioned to help stimulate local governments to put premium on transparency and accountability to enable them to avail themselves of financial support to jumpstart and sustain local socio-economic development initiatives supportive of national government goals and priorities.

The PCF aims to recognize good governance performance of LGUs exhibiting good performance in internal housekeeping particularly on the areas of transparency and accountability, planning, fiscal management, and valuing performance monitoring.

### **PAYAPA AT MASAGANANG PAMAYANAN (PAMANA)**

PAYapa at MASaganang PamayaNAn or PAMANA is the national government's convergence program that extends development interventions to isolated, hard-to-reach and conflict-affected communities, ensuring that they are not left behind.

A complementary track to peace negotiations, the program is anchored on the Aquino administration's strategy of winning the peace by forging strategic partnerships with national agencies in promoting convergent delivery of goods and services, and addressing regional development challenges in conflict-affected and vulnerable areas (CAAs/CVAs). The design and delivery of PAMANA is conflict-sensitive and peace-promoting (CSPP) to avoid the recurrence of any source of conflict.



### SUBAYBAYAN

The SubayBAYAN System is the official platform of DILG in the monitoring and reporting of progress of the implementation of all Locally-Funded Projects (LFPs). It is an online application system that provides real time information on the physical and financial status of subprojects; information on actual location of subprojects thru map overlays and dashboard graphical presentations. SubayBAYAN promotes accountability and transparency in the implementation of projects of LGUs.

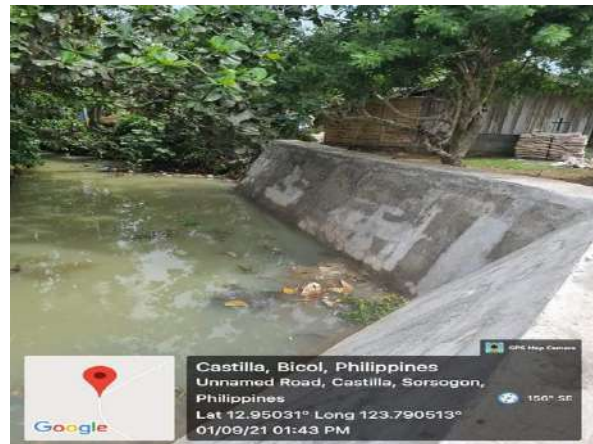
